- opportunities for mixed uses and multi-level development that can achieve multiple objectives, eg car parking, community facilities and/or commercial lettable space, in addition to the affordable housing outcome.

## **Background**

Funding is presently available through the Federal government. As such, this may be the appropriate time to increase both parking and housing stock (both affordable and at market rates). The benefits of these changes would be: revenue raised from the sale of 'at market' properties, as well as increase revenue collected from rates on the new properties.

An associated benefit for the community and the environment would be to create housing which has good access to public transport. I believe Holdfast Bay has the will and capacity to meet these kinds of environmental imperatives.

## 9.2 Repairs to Stone Walls at Glenelg Oval

## **Background**

The collapse of the stone wall on the foreshore on New Years Eve reminded me of the concerns expressed by some users of the Glenelg Oval about the lean on the masonry walls.

I think it is very important we take immediate step to eliminate the risk these walls may place the children at the Glenelg School under.

In some sections you can see directly through the wall, as shown in the photographs below.

Like the trip hazards on a footpath I believe we may have a duty of care to fix this failing infrastructure which children regularly play on.

The Glenelg Air Raid Shelter is currently being used as a museum but there appears to be no constraint on this area being leased by the club as a Gym, meeting room, a hall of fame for past players etc.

In the interest of preserving a remaining part of the history at the Glenelg Oval, I think it is important that council obtain legal access and control of this area.
