14.18 Home and Community Care (HACC) Social and Recreational Activities Mapping Project (Report No: 197/12)

This purpose of this report is to present Council with findings and recommendations following a comprehensive Home and Community Care (HACC) Social and Recreational Activities Mapping Project. The aim of the project was to identify the social and recreational needs for HACC eligible residents and match them to the existing opportunities within the city. At the same time, in response to Council resolution C240309/156, the project investigated the possibility of duplication of community services within the City of Holdfast Bay.

The project identified that whilst there may be a perception of duplication, with similar services offered in various locations across the city of Holdfast Bay, each service caters to a specific target group or geographic location and very little duplication actually occurs. However, the project did identify six key

recommendations that would create greater cohesion between providers, enhance and streamline availability of information and foster opportunities for networking and partnerships.

1. That Council notes the findings of the report, which are:

- That a number of community organisations provide a diverse range of social and recreational activities for local City of Holdfast Bay residents.
- That there is no actual duplication of community services, despite the number of similar services offered in various locations across council, because each service caters to a specific target group or geographic location.
- That stakeholder relationships between these community organisations is limited, which could lead to duplication of services.
- That community organisations need advice and practical support to help them market their services and attract new members
- 2. That Council endorses the recommendations and action plan outlined in the HACC Social and Recreational Activities Mapping Project report, which are:
 - Enhance relationships with key stakeholders that provide social and recreational activities
 - Identify opportunities for increased networking and promoting partnerships between organisations
 - Establish sustainable avenues for socialisation for local HACC eligible residents
 - Identify organisations that are best placed to address service gaps and unmet need
 - Increase awareness and availability of information about all social and recreational opportunities within the City of Holdfast Bay
 - Foster social engagement to promote wellbeing and quality of life
