14.2 **The Amazon Bar – Application for Restaurant Liquor Licence** (Report No: 106/15)

Planning consent has been given for the establishment of a new dessert bar at shop 2/4-6 Brighton Road Glenelg East. 'The Amazon Bar' will be a small dessert bar that offers cheese and anti-pasto platters, finger food, ice cream and waffles, as well as a range of chocolate beverages and coffees.

As part of the dessert bar's establishment the proprietors are also seeking to obtain a Restaurant Liquor Licence which will permit the licensee to provide liquor to customers in addition to other food and beverage services.

As development application (DA) 110/0284/14 (change of use from office to restaurant) condition 4. restricts the trading hours of the premises to 5:00pm to 11:30pm Monday to Sunday, and condition 3. restricts the premise capacity to 19 patrons at any one time, combined with the inherent restrictive conditions of a Restaurant Licence, this application is considered 'low risk' to the amenity of the area.

As this application is in line with Council's current Liquor Licencing Policy (2011), and does not contravene any further development issues it is recommended that Council endorse the proposed liquor licence and associated conditions outlined in this report.

The applicant is now seeking Council comment prior to lodging an application with Consumer and Business Services.

- 2. That in accordance with condition 4 of Development Application 110/00284/14 the hours of liquor service for all internal areas is restricted to Monday to Sunday 5:00pm to 11:30pm;
- 3. That the sought section 34 (1) (c) exemption reflect the above hours;
- 4. That in accordance with condition 10 of Development Application 110/00284/14 only low level background music is to be played within the internal areas of the premises;
- 5. That the licensee will not apply to vary the licence without first seeking approval from the City of Holdfast Bay.
