14.3 Street Tree Strategy Planting Guide – Gordon Street, Glenelg (Report No: 212/15)

Council is requested to consider amending the Street Tree Strategy Planting Guide for Gordon Street, Glenelg, from *Jacaranda mimosifolia* on both sides of the road, to *Araucaria heterophylla* (Norfolk Island Pine) on the eastern side (even side) and *Celtis australis* (Mediterranean Hackberry) on the western side (odd side).

At the 26 May 2015 meeting, Council approved (C260515/108) that Council administration may use their discretion to select a different tree species for planting to that listed in the Street Tree Strategy Planting Guide, except in the case of *Araucaria heterophylla* (Norfolk Island Pine) where Council should be consulted. Whilst the Street Tree Strategy Planting Guide has *Jacaranda mimosifolia* listed, the predominant species along Gordon Street is *Araucaria heterophylla* (Norfolk Island Pine).

14.4 Request to Change Boundary Alignments at 92 The Esplanade, Hove and 42 The Crescent, Brighton (Report No: 211/15)

Council has been approached by two separate residents in relation to anomalies in the alignment of boundaries at their respective properties. These anomalies have come to light as a result of recent purchases of the property or proposed development of a vacant portion of land. Both of these matters relate to the creation or transfer of land that would be classified as Road Reserve. To rectify this, a formal process is required to be undertaken as part of the Roads Opening and Closing Act (1991) before Council can resolve to dispose of or create a portion of road.

Motion C140715/154

That Council agrees:

- To commence a road opening and closure process pursuant to the Roads (Opening and Closing) Act 1991(SA) in respect of the portion of land associated with 92 The Esplanade, Hove and known as Allotment 1, so as to realign the road reserve to be consistent with other property boundaries in the area as highlighted on the plan in Attachment 1 to this report.
- 2. To commence a road opening process pursuant to the *Roads (Opening and Closing) Act 1991(SA)* in respect of the portion of land attached to 42. The Crescent and known as Allotment 8, Brighton, highlighted on the plan in Attachment 2 to this report to become part of Council's road reserve.
- 3. To authorise the Chief Executive Officer to undertake all actions required to commence the roads opening and closure process and to prepare a report for the Council on the outcome of the public consultation required by section 14 of the Roads opening and Closing Act in order for the Council to consider any applications and objections received to the proposed roads opening and closure.
- 4. That, having consideration to the relevant parts of the Council's policy on the sale and disposal of surplus land pursuant to section 49 of the Local Government Act 1999 (SA), the Council authorises the Chief Executive Officer or delegate to negotiate the transfer (at no cost) of road reserve associated with 92 The Esplanade providing that the owner meets all costs associated with the transfer, on the basis that if and when the

portion of subject road is closed as a public road, the Council will dispose of the subject road.
